•	Other Nursery and Classroom Furniture, Equipment & Décor	\$17,200

REMAINING MILESTONES:

ADULT CHAIR PLAN

As we prepare to furnish Saratoga Hall, we have developed a plan we'd like to call "The Great Chair Migration." Our goals are to:

- 1. Cycle out our oldest chairs in poorest condition,
- 2. Relocate other existing chairs to more stationary locations to extend their useful life, and
- 3. Purchase new and more durable replacement chairs for our highest and most interchangeable location (the Gym).

The Great Chair Migration:

- 1. **Harrington Hall** 348 brown Vinyl and cloth chairs will be moved out. (*Note: These chairs are 35 to 40 years old. Based on their condition, most will be recycled, and a few will be in a condition worthy of gifting).*
- 2. **Wayland Sanctuary and Hearth Room** 242 Maroon cloth chairs will be relocated into Harrington Hall 2nd floor classrooms which will remain in use after Milestone #3.
- 3. **Montgomery Hall** In 2007, our Chapel Family purchased 800 new brown fabric chairs for worship and banquet settings. These chairs are stacked and moved often, causing above average wear. Relocation to more stationary locations will help extend their useful life.
 - ➤ 100 chairs will be relocated into Harrington Hall 1st floor classrooms.
 - > 180 chairs will be relocated into Wayland Sanctuary and the Hearth room.
 - > 520 chairs will be relocated into Saratoga Hall 2nd floor classrooms and "Upper Room."

New chairs will be purchased for Montgomery Hall, which we hope will provide many years of service for this high use and most interchangeable location.

It is our sincere belief that these plans provide the best stewardship of available furniture.

How can we reach this next important milestone together?

 - 1. Consider **giving monthly** above and beyond your regular tithe.
